## Capital Campaign and Building Projects Update

Thanks to you all for your support of this capital campaign and these building projects.

As of February 23, 2025 we have received \$ 151,000 in gifts and pledges.

Of this amount we have already received \$58,450.

The budgeted cost of the work on the sanctuary windows, solar panels, mini splits in the office and education area, and kitchen floor totals \$300,000.

The loan from the PCUSA Investment Loan Program is in process and the closing date at this time is March 21. This loan will give us the working capital (or cash flow) we need to get the projects going while giving us time to get them paid for.

In December 2024 we signed a contract with Glass Heritage for \$ 47,587.00 plus tax. This contract covers Phase 1 of the sanctuary windows and covers the three most critical windows that need immediate attention.


Session voted on 2/19/25 to sign and send the required deposits for the Solar Project and Phase II of

the windows. Session also voted to approve moving forward on the heating/cooling (mini split) units for the education wing. We will update you on a tentative schedule for these projects as the vendors let us know.

Remember and honor a loved one this Easter season by purchasing an Easter lily and decorating the church sanctuary.




## Blessing of Seed and Soil, Sunday, April 6th

The service of Blessing of Seed and Soil is also known as Rogation Sunday. I learned about Rogation Sunday when I was in seminary in Dubuque through a rural ministry class. Rogation, the practice of offering prayers and fasting in order to beseech God's blessing on seed, soil, and harvest has been around since the 6th Century. Today it is more widely practiced in the Roman Catholic or Anglican traditions but Protestants have adapted the practice to fit their worship as well.



During worship on April 6th, we will gather to ask God to bless the seed and soil. We will ask God to bless and keep safe those who work the land and tend the animals that feed us.
